1. **ADDITIONAL 90-DAYS OF EMERGENCY CHILDCARE.** Scenarios:
 - a. Child enrolled from April 4 – May 2 care extends to September 28, 2020 (60 days to June 30 plus 90 thereafter)
 - b. Child enrolled June 1, care extends to October 28, 2020 (60 days to July 28 plus 90 thereafter)
 - c. Child enrolled on June 30 care extend to November 28, 2020 (60 days plus 90 thereafter)
 - d. DISENROLLED families can be reenrolled up to July 15 and provided an additional 90 days. This can be done by either issuing a family a Notice of Action (NOA) or a letter notifying them of re-enrollment
 - e. CONTINUED ENROLLED families too must be issued a NOA or a letter notifying them of the continuation of extended care.

NOTE: If an agency projects to have unspent Emergency Childcare funds, an agency may provide more childcare past the 90 days

2. **FAMILY FEES –**
 - a. At the time that CAPP and CMAP contractors notify families of the fee assessment, they must also notify provider of the assessed fees and the date fees are to be collected from the families. Per [Education Code 8227.7](#) this can be done either electronically or if requested by the childcare provider, via mail.
 - b. Family fees are effective either July 1, 2020, or the date the family was re-enrolled in Emergency Childcare, and for the month of July only, are due fourteen (14) days after notification of the fee assessment. Fees will become delinquent on the date they are due. Failure to pay the family fee could result in disenrollment from Emergency Childcare. **Unlike in ongoing childcare, in Emergency Childcare if a family appeals the contractor’s decision to assess family fees, and if the family’s appeal of the assessed family fee is successful, the contractor shall issue a refund of overpayment of fees, as applicable.**

3. **Other –**
 - a. Families who were enrolled in Emergency Childcare on or before June 30, 2020 must be prioritized for ongoing care before other families that were not enrolled in Emergency Childcare are enrolled.
 - b. SB 98 does not provide a 90-day extension for Emergency Childcare for families enrolled in emergency childcare in CSPP, CCTR or CFCC.
 - c. Contractors shall issue families transitioning from Emergency Childcare into ongoing childcare a NOA informing them of their twelve-month (12) eligibility in accordance with EC Section 8263 (h) and MB 17-14.
 - d. ELC contractors that obtained a signed Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Self-Certification form for families who were enrolled into Emergency Childcare shall not be held responsible for determining if a parent or guardian’s work is “essential” or if a family is an at-risk population.
