### ALAMEDA COUNTY CHILD CARE EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM!

Leaders from community agencies including Hively, 4C's of Alameda County, BANANAS, Early Care and Education Planning Council, First 5 Alameda County, Alameda County Social Services, Alameda County Office of Education, and Alameda County Public Health, started meeting daily to discuss how to best meet the child care needs in Alameda County. This group later was named the Alameda County Emergency Child Care Response Team. Our group continued to provide endless support to families and child care providers throughout the year!







### HIVELY COVID-19 EMERGENCY FUND!

In an effort to quickly pull together resources to support our community, Hively started the COVID-19 Emergency Fund. The funds we've raised have gone to to rental assistance, food, diapers, and other essential items.

Due to the generous funding from Safeway-Nourishing Neighbors Program, Hively was able to go grocery shopping to provide food to our community! During the year, we've provided over 100,000 meals for children and families!

### THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC THROUGH A TRAUMA INFORMED LENS

Community members joined Hively CEO Kelly O'Lague Dulka, MSW, for an opportunity for dialogue and discussion on the COVID-19 pandemic through a trauma-informed lens. Ongoing training around trauma-informed practices have helped us better understand the needs of those we serve.

To assist child care providers that remained open to care for the children of essential workers, Hively provided bags full of masks, cleaning supplies, children's books, and \$500 gift cards! # COMMUNITY DIAPER AND CLOTHING DISTRIBUTION

Throughout the year, Hively continued to provide monthly distributions to families in Alameda County. Every month, Hively distributes resources to over 250 families, including up to 40,000 diapers, baby formula and wipes, PPE supplies, clothing, gift cards, and food.

In July we opened up the doors to our Community Closet to allow the community to shop for infant and adult clothing, jackets, toys, business/interview attire, bedding, household items, books, and so much more!







### **CLOTH MASKS!**

Hively distributed thousands of cloth masks to the community. We partnered with local women-owned businesses, and were even excited to debut our own Hively cloth masks!

# TRI-VALLEY COMMUNITY HELP DURING SHELTER IN PLACE: BOOKS AND BOXES DRIVE!

Hively was extremely lucky to be the recipients of local Facebook Group, Tri-Valley Community Help During Shelter in Place. Their drive alone allowed Hively to distribute 3,208 children's books and 1,202 boxes of cereal to our families!
