

The Rising Cost of Child Care: A Growing Challenge

Child care costs are steadily increasing, often surpassing what families can afford. Experts recommend that child care expenses should not exceed 7% of a family's income—a benchmark many are struggling to meet. There's good news. Ventura County has seen an increase in child care availability over the past year. However, the demand for infant care still far exceeds the available supply, leaving many families in need. Referrals for all ages continue to be in demand. CDR is dedicated to supporting families by helping make child care more affordable and expanding the availability of child care spaces to meet growing needs.

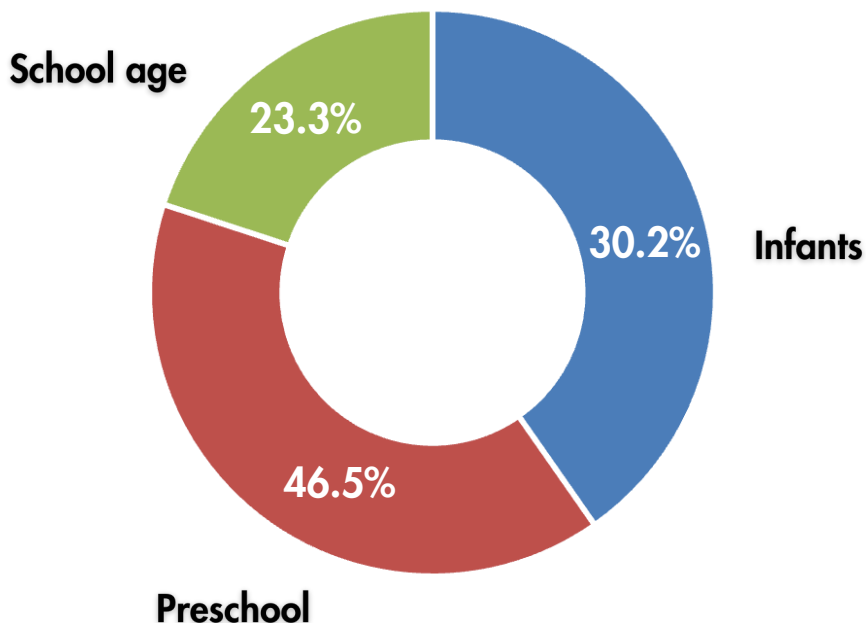
