

## ABOUT CRC

Community Resources for Children (CRC) strives to build a community where every child has a path to a bright future through a supportive network of parents, caregivers and community partners. CRC provides adults who care for children with the knowledge, tools and resources so that children continue to learn and thrive through the following programs and services in Napa County:



## CHILD CARE SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES

CRC helps families find and pay for child care through a wrap-around care model that includes referrals to local resources including housing, food and mental health.

## CHILD CARE EXPANSION

CRC continues to build capacity to increase the availability of high-quality child care options in Napa County. In the last 3 years, through 1:1 coaching and our child care business fundamentals program, CRC has helped launch 34 new women-owned child care businesses, thereby creating 360 new child care slots and enabling 416 adults to enter or remain in the workforce.

## ACADEMY FOR CHILD CARE EDUCATORS

CRC supports child care providers such as educators, licensed child care providers and family, friend and neighbor caregivers with wrap-around services, webinars and workshops on topics such as early childhood education, trauma-informed care, emergency preparedness, supporting dual language learners, and understanding developmental milestones.

## PARENT & CAREGIVER EDUCATION

CRC serves as a hub for families and caregivers by providing a range of services including peer support groups and education about developmental milestones, ASQ developmental screenings, a Toy Library and an Early Learning Center, school readiness programs, and bilingual playgroups.

## FY2023-2024 IMPACT

- 4,711 Napa County residents served, 85% from low-income households.
- 2,952 children strengthened through CRC's early learning and care programs.
- 936 children enrolled in free or low-cost child care allowing adults to work and children to learn and grow.
- 434 caregivers and child care providers strengthened their ability to care for young children by accessing peer support groups, and workshops on topics such as Trauma-Informed Care, anti-bias education, CPR & First Aid, supporting children with special needs and understanding developmental milestones.

## FY2023-2024 OUTCOMES

- 95% of parents report being less stressed and less worried about the future after enrolling their children in the child care of their choice with financial assistance from CRC.
- 96% of parents report seeing a positive change in their child's development since enrolling in child care.
- 100% of child care providers and caregivers are confident in their understanding of child development and implementing the skills they learned after participating in our programs.
- 96% of child care providers feel better equipped to sustain their child care business after attending our trainings.



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
