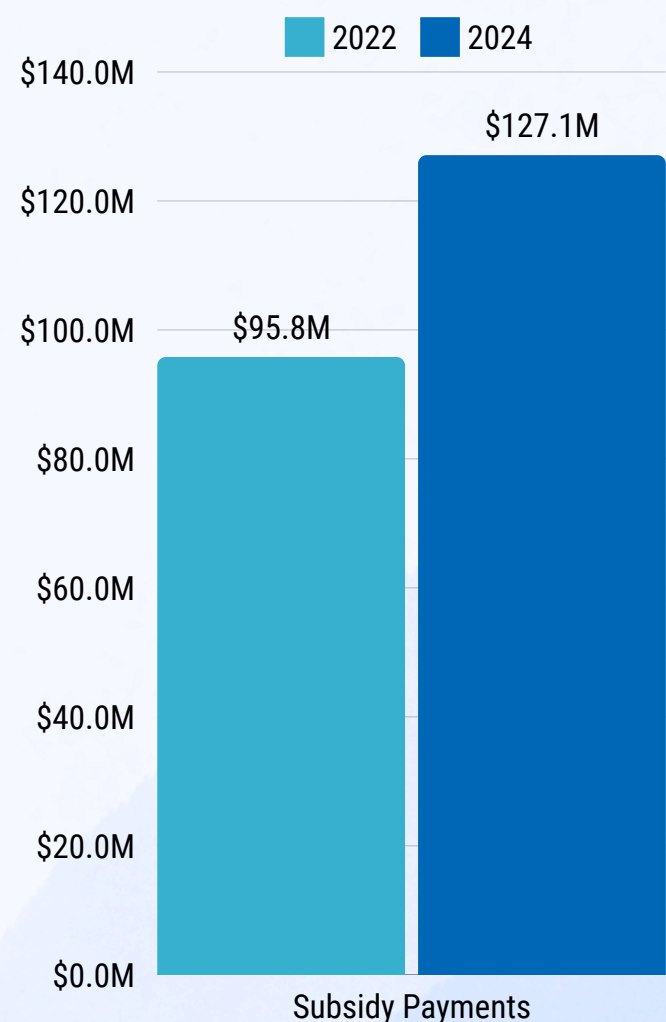
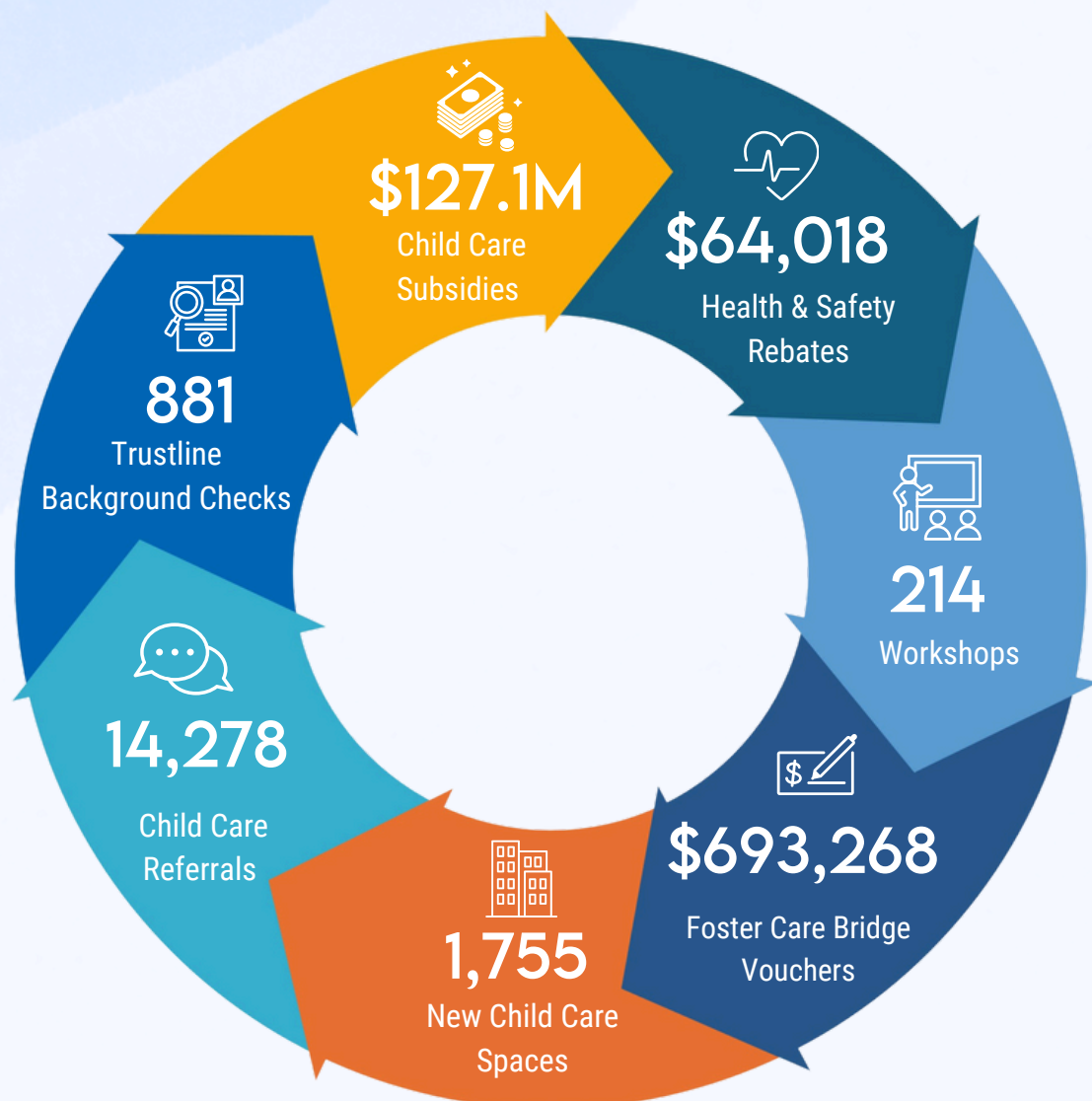




## A SNAPSHOT OF THE CHILD CARE LANDSCAPE IN SACRAMENTO COUNTY

Statewide, the increase in subsidy dollars has enabled more income-eligible families to access stable, quality child care. In fact, between FY 2022-23 and FY 2023-24, we have seen a 24.7% increase in children utilizing Sacramento County's child care subsidy program thanks to the funding increases from the state. Yet, according to the most recent data regarding the availability of child care for working families, only 27-30% of eligible children in Sacramento County have access to child care in their area.\* The need remains great amid limited resources. We appreciate your support in protecting dedicated child care slots and funding this legislative year to ensure all children and families in our communities have equal opportunities to thrive and prosper.

**\$64,018** health & safety training rebates for **667** providers.



**6,140** child care providers and parents attended **214** workshops.



**236** children received **\$693,268** in Foster Care Bridge child care vouchers.



**214** family child care homes and **1** child care centers opened creating new spaces for **1,755** children.



**14,278** requests for child care referrals for **13,468** children.



**881** family, friend or neighbor exempt providers registered through Trustline.
