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Communicating Effectively with Parents Betsy Haas, Founder, Esteemed Human Development International Parents and staff are partners in learning to work together for he highest and best for the child. When parents and staff communicate, children's needs are met more effectively. When parents participate, it enhances children's learning. By being supportive and nurturing each other, we create a caring community. Just as parents need to be recognized for their best abilities, staff must self acknowledge their capabilities to create partnerships with parents that create trust and credibility. Once parents REAL- LY know that you are in partnership with them and not ABOVE them, the journey for success has begun! This workshop will explore what are the elements that must be developed in order to have healthy and open relationships with parents with the goal of strengthening the family.	January 2012
Work-Life Integration Betsy Haas, Founder, Esteemed Human Development International The specific focus of this session is to ensure that staff are conscious of creating a work environment that is balanced in the four energy fields as identified by Tony Schwartz in his work, The Energy Project. To perform at our peak, humans need to satisfy four key needs. In order to be truly effective it is imperative that staff maintain focus on keeping these fields balanced. The Four Forgotten Needs that Energize Great Performance makes a compelling case for a new kind of workplace resulting in a better way of working and a more deeply satisfying life. In this session we will see how employers and employees have unconsciously begun operating like computers: continuously, at increasing speed, running multiple programs simultaneously resulting in an unbalanced life. We well learn how to recreate a balance by meeting our four key needs - physical, emotional, mental (self-expression) and spiritual (significance). Participants will explore and experience tips that will facilitate this process resulting in a more balanced life style and a richer and more fulfilling life in all quadrants.	February 2012
Creating Peace Through Understanding Relationships Laurie Prusso, Professor of Child Development, Modesto Junior College, TeacherLaurie.com Judgment, strategies, criticism, and control are all ways that we react to parents with children who struggle. We promote and extend aggression in families and aggravate challenging behaviors when we behave in ways that distance families from us. There is a better way to respond to children and their fam- ilies and it is based on building respectful relationships with them. Aggressive or disrespectful re- sponses to parents and to children is a key way that we promote ongoing conflict and resist creating spac- es for peaceful and respectful interactions and relationships to occur. This workshop focuses on how our reactions and responses invite behaviors and actions that we really wish to avoid and will teach participants how to understand others and respond with respectful and peaceful interactions that build safety and promote peace. Positive Discipline for Handling Difficult Behavior Ronald Mah, M.A., Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist, www.RonaldMah.com The webinar addresses when children present difficult behavior. Participants will be introduced to basic principles that will lead to effective interventions, and to conceptual clarity that, in turn, lead to effective discipline. Since children are more than their behaviors, the webinar will discuss potential underlying issues that both cause acting out and promote adult clarity that will lead to positive discipline. Individual needs are balanced with the socialization necessary to be successful in the classroom or family community.	April 2012
