Children and Trauma Patty Wipfler, Program Director and Founder, Hand in Hand Parenting Each year in the United States approximately five million children experience some form of traumatic experience-natural disasters, car accidents, life-threatening medical conditions, painful procedures, exposure to community violence. Traumatic experiences can have a devastating impact on a child, altering their physical, emotional, cognitive and social development. Children seek answers and comfort from adults around them, yet we often feel helpless in this role. While adults do not have all the answers,	June 2014

they can help children better understand the traumatic event and the ways we respond following trauma.

Meeting the Diverse Needs of Young Children

The increase in racial, ethnic, and cultural diversity in American schools is reflected in many early childhood classrooms. These classrooms also are receiving increased numbers of children with disabilities or developmental delays. The diverse composition of early childhood classrooms brings many challenges as well as many opportunities to educators. With a knowledge of effective practices, and with the support of administrators, colleagues, families, and the local and global community, teachers can create classrooms that are responsive to the diverse needs of all children.

Increasing Parent Participation

During this presentation, we will discuss tips on reaching out to parents and getting them more involved August 2014 in your program. We will discuss actions you can take, such as developing a parent handbook and running dynamic parent meetings.

Transition to Kindergarten: School Readiness Tools for Early Childhood Teachers

As each new school year begins, adults who work with children in the year before kindergarten have much to think about. Kindergarten teachers report that more than half of children enter school not optimally ready to learn. Too often, preparation for kindergarten does not begin until a month or two just before kindergarten begins. Transition to kindergarten is a process that is most successful when it is carefully planned out over the entire pre-kindergarten year. Whether a child is in preschool, child care or spending time with parents or caregivers at home, the transition to kindergarten can be a stressful time for parents, educators and children. This presentation will explore the many aspects of kindergarten readiness in order to make this new journey a positive experience for all involved.
