



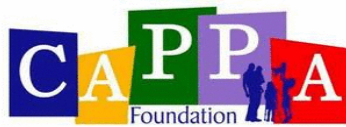

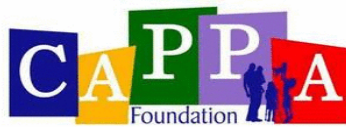
### ***Emotional Literacy and Diversity Training***

### **Anger Management and Diversity Training**

Talking with Young Children about Upsetting and Angry Feelings: Describing Feelings in Ways Children Understand; Anger as an Energy that can be Interrupted in Ourselves and in Others; Working with and Learning from Parents and Guardians Ways They Express Upset Feelings and Anger and Listening for Racial, Cultural, Ethnic, Gender and Religious Differences in People's Language and Tone; Using Your Own Feelings to Talk with Children about Anger; Holding Circles for Children to Discuss Ways They Can Interrupt Upsetting and Angry Feelings inside Themselves: Distraction, Soothing, Expression, Re-Channeling, etc; Expressing Anger to Others without Put Downs or Verbal Bullying; Using Groups and Role Plays to Practice Expressing and Responding to Anger and Other Upsetting Emotions and Apologizing; Ways to Heal after Anger between Themselves and Other People and Multi-Cultural Ways to Close Your Days with Children and their Families

### **Get Ready, Stay Ready: Disaster Preparedness Training for Center Based Facilities**

### **Seeds to Seedlings—Incorporating Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) into Everyday Practice**

Learn how to design developmentally appropriate STEM activities for your family child care or center based program. Children are naturally curious. They desire to question, explore, and investigate new things. They want to know how things work. They watch and learn through exploration and hands on activities. Building on everyday activities, in both indoor and outdoor space, preschool educators will learn new STEM activities and how to expand on children's natural interest. Educators will also learn what questions to ask children to help them learn how to investigate, analyze, and predict what they are experiencing and observing. Learn how to integrate the foundations of STEM into your early learning environment and strategies to strengthen children's understanding of STEM. Preschool is the perfect time to cultivate children's interest in science, technology, engineering, and math!

### **Teach Beginning Reading Skills and Meet Standards Through Play!**
